Illustrations may be added up to 5 per author.

TEXT

1. Text files must be MS Office Word compatible (.docx / .odt) and PDF.
2. The line spacing is 1.5.
3. As font, please use Times New Roman with a font size of 11 pt.
4. For footnotes and captions the font size is 9 pt.
5. Footnotes follow punctuations, for instance .⁵⁶ ,⁶⁹ ;³)⁷⁷]³⁶
6. In the footnotes, as a method of quotation please use the author-year-system:
 - Pomponio 2010, 14; Pomponio 2010, 13-14; Pomponio 2010, 13, 15; Pomponio 2010, 14, fn. 1.
 - For two authors: Pomponio – Verderame 2010, 230.
 - For more than two authors quote as follows: Edzard *et alii* 1977, 20.
7. Please use the following quotation marks: “ ” and ‘ ’
8. The title should be a font size of 13 pt., bold.
9. Author name and affiliation should be a font size of 12 pt., regular. They should be placed under the title, *e.g.*, Annunziata Rositani (University of Messina).
10. You can use headings and subheadings only up to two levels:
 1. level: Times New Roman, 12 pt., bold [**1. Heading**]
 2. level: Times New Roman, 12 pt., bold and italics [**1.1. Subheading**]
